Featured Mural:

10 26710 S Mooney Bl

- 'Welcome to Visalia' (2021)**
Completed by the Urbanists, it makes a great spot for a selfie. Urbanists Collective combine art and social change.
- 'Giant Sequoias' (2000)**
This enormous mural covers the entire width of the building and highlights sequoia trees since Visalia is Gateway to the Sequoias.
- 'Moro Rock' (2003)**
Iconic Moro Rock in Sequoia National Park is highlighted in this mural by the Teen Mural Program
- Vietnam Veteran War Memorial (2003)**
By artist Rudy Vargas immortalizing the Vietnam war and honoring its veterans.
- Sierra Nevada Mountains**
Measuring 14 X 28 feet, it was completed under direction of Allison Kleinstuber in 2001 by the Teen Mural Program.
- 'Smoke Break' (2002)**
Based on a photo taken in Korea in 1951; by artist Rudy Vargas.
- 'Coca Cola'**
Originally painted in 1940 as an ad but was later covered over. Discovered during a construction project. Take a selfie sipping 'the real thing.'
- Valley Illumination**
Valley Illumination was created by Eric Rodriguez. He wanted to display the nature through which all life flowed, the first native people of the land, and the agriculture that shaped future towns we live in now.
- Visalia Fort**
Visalia Fort by Michael Vasquez is a vibrant tribute to the heart of California's Central Valley, encapsulating the essence of Visalia's rich agricultural heritage.
- The Greatest Generation**
Commemorating WWII, it depicts 29 people across a wall 24 feet high and 71 feet wide. It was painted on Dibond tiles and affixed to wall; by Artist Glen W. Hill. *Not downtown*
